Bringing Light Into the Lives of “Shadow Survivors” A message from the Executive Director

Seven years ago, I would never have imagined that we'd one day be celebrating the success of a national nonprofit organization, founded as a result of battling my family's personal ordeal. Yet here we are, now three years old, serving over 4,500 children from every U.S. state and Canada! Seven years ago, my youngest son, Spencer, taught me what it was to be a true “super sib” as we fought the childhood cancer in our family. During our challenge, Spencer received the gift of a

personalized trophy in the mail that deeply touched his life – and became the catalyst for SuperSibs! From darkness and debilitating challenge has come

strength, courage and hope for these thousands of “shadow survivors” and their families. In this eye-blink of time, SuperSibs! has made an indelible imprint in the pediatric cancer world.

I may look fine on the outside... but on the inside, I'm suffering.

We hear this message over and over from the siblings we serve. These children feel afraid, angry, jealous, guilty, traumatized, abandoned and invisible. It's our job – **our mission** – to help re-define the cancer experience so these kids no

longer feel forgotten, no longer feel insignificant – but rather, can face the future with courage, strength and hope. We're letting these brothers and sisters know that it's ok to feel how they feel and that they're not alone. It is profoundly humbling and gratifying to open the SuperSibs! mail each day. Children and parents send us poignant and simple messages, pictures, drawings and emails, expressing how deeply we make a difference.

Sib Support Looks Like This

SuperSibs! services aren't rocket science. We're simply providing consistent, ongoing support for these children at risk — the siblings of children with cancer. What we do...

Comfort Mailings

After each referred family receives their personalized Parent and Sibling Welcome Packages (with information, inspiration and fun support items), SuperSibs! kids (the siblings) receive additional age-appropriate comfort packages mailed directly to them. These mailings include items to just brighten the child's day, like Smilecards, personalized Courage


Trophies, CD Cases, Sweet Dreams Pillowcases, Computer Games, Inspiration Rocks and more. Other mailed packages include tools to help these young children and teens to cope and manage through the roller coaster of emotions they experience, often for years. These items include custom-designed Journals for siblings, Newsletters, Sibling Guides, Books, guided-imagery Audio CD's for teens and much more. Just remembering these children with relevant support tools and caring messages has brought piles of mail,

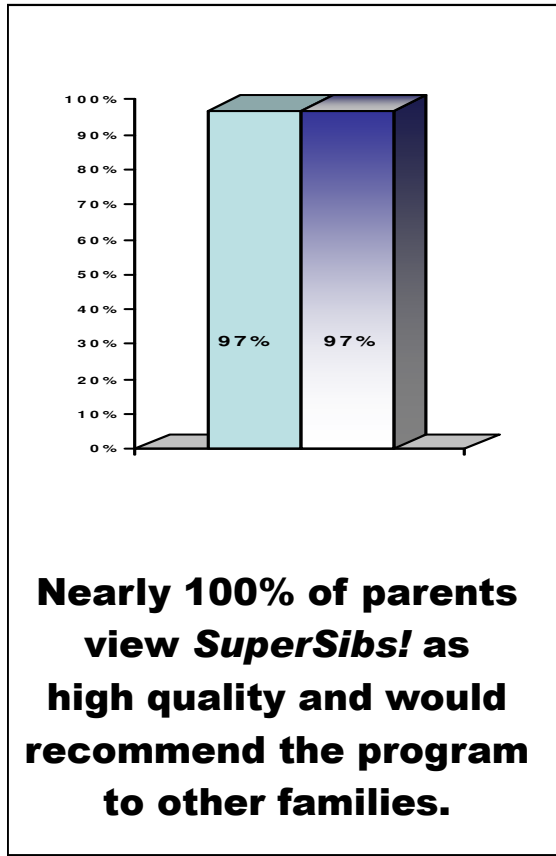
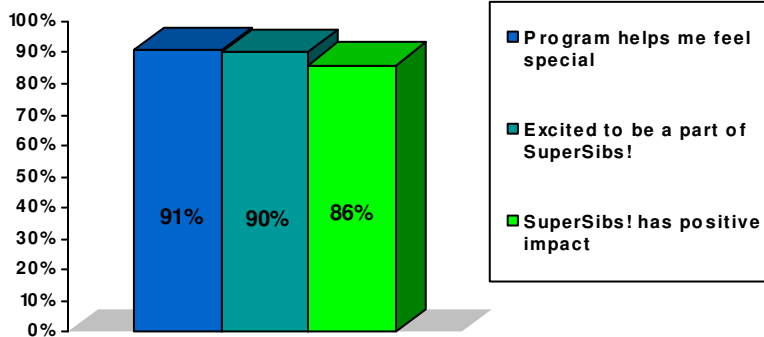

And The Survey Says... (Drum roll, please!)

Each year, *SuperSibs!* sends personal surveys to every child participating in our program, and to their parents. To maximize the use of our resources and the impact of our work, this feedback is crucial. Below is a summary of our 2005 Survey responses from 185 parents and 242 siblings:

The vast majority of siblings say *SuperSibs!* has had a positive impact on them.



The largest proportion of sibs and parents say “Just keep doing what you’re doing”. Of the suggested changes, recommendations included more frequent mailings, more personal contact and increased age-appropriate categories of materials (further breakdown for youngest children and oldest teens).

We're so grateful for the feedback... and are focused on continuous improvement!

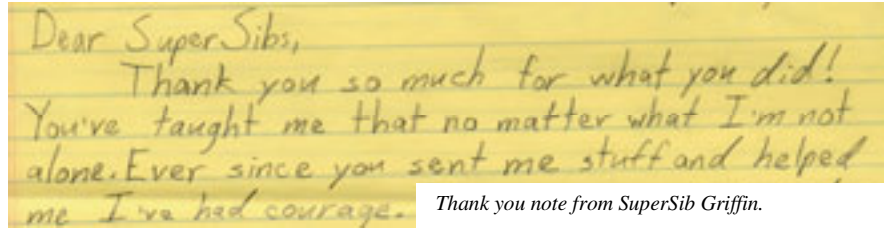
from children and their parents, poignantly expressing their effusive gratitude.

Grief Comfort

Tragically, many of the children we serve lose their sibling to cancer. Our hearts break for these kids, who have so lost their innocence and childhood... and now, their beloved brother or sister and life as they once knew it. Our firm motto is, "Once a SuperSib, Always a SuperSib", so bereaved children remain in our program. They've already lost so much. They will not lose us, too. Our grief comfort mailings bring a source of hope and light as these kids begin to heal and face the future.

Outreach Awareness and Education

We don't have to be "the one" to provide the solution to sibling healing... we just want the problem solved. This means that *SuperSibs!* can and does play in integral role in professional and community education and sensitivity training to enable others to help solve the problem together. We focus on providing information, programming and coaching to help hospital professionals and cancer-related organization leaders integrate sibling support into their everyday services.

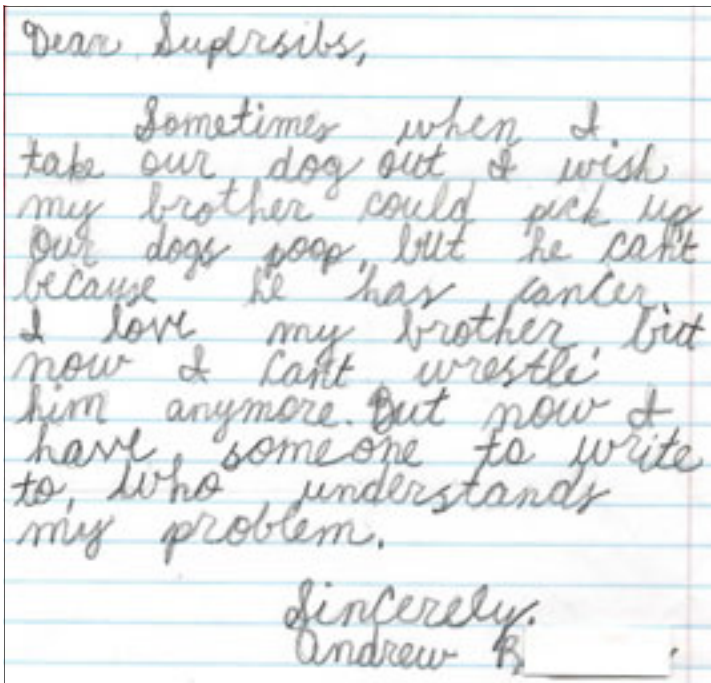
Scholarship Program

IMPACT REPORT: 2005 Highlights

We “tell it like it is”. Here’s a feel for what we’ve accomplished together!


- Served **4,015 SuperSibs!** kids ages 4 to 18 with free ongoing services.
- Siblings were referred from all 50 states, plus DC and Canada.
- Over 260 referring institutions/hospitals and over 120 “cancer camps” refer kids to us.
- Sent each sibling ten personalized mailings throughout the year, bringing hope and comfort to manage the pediatric cancer “roller coaster”. Items included courage trophies, support books and journals, handmade Smilecards, Inspiration Rocks and special reminders that these kids aren’t alone, including our special *SuperSibs!* Shoe Thingz, T-shirts and much more.
- Awarded 2 new *SuperSibs!* Manne Family Foundation Scholarships and 2 new *SuperSibs!* Scholarships and learned from each heart-wrenching, pure essay about life and impact of cancer on siblings.
- Thanks to a restricted grant from the government, we hosted a 2 day Sibling Resource Collaboration Conference with leaders from 17 pediatric oncology-related organizations — resulting in multiple new sib-support offerings and partnership programs.
- We provided additional support to 22 *SuperSibs!* families who were displaced by Hurricane Katrina and Rita.
- When a child dies from cancer, their siblings need us more than ever. Our message is clear: *Once a SuperSib, Always a SuperSib*. Once notified, we provide “hope and comfort” grief support packages to help these children heal.
- We’re “on the map” — having been invited to educate and present at national conferences — from Ronald McDonald House Charities, to Association of Pediatric Oncology Nurses, to Association of Pediatric Oncology Social Workers, Child Life Council and more.
- We were specially recognized in the Lance Armstrong Foundation Annual Report and we partnered with the National Institute of Health to create a vital Teen Sibling Guide.
- Newsweek, CBS, Fox News and AP Radio featured *SuperSibs!* with stories to educate the public on this important, untold issue. 

And What About 2006?

-  Listen for our national radio PSA, produced pro bono by GCI Group and Media Link.
-  Thus far, we’ve provided custom-produced Guided Imagery CDs for our teen sibs, sent Sweet Dreams Pillowcases to comfort our youngest kids, added new Grief-Specific Support and piloted our moderated Teen Chat Room together with Starlight Starbright Children’s Foundation.
-  Our dedicated volunteer Scholarship Committee is preparing to announce our 2006 *SuperSibs!* Scholarship awards (5) and our talented staff and terrific volunteers have provided new, impactful, age-appropriate support mailings each month to every sibling in our program.
-  *SuperSibs!* is developing a collaborative Sibling Research Plan to stimulate widespread early intervention programs to help siblings long into the future.



We receive over 210 referrals a month... and anticipate serving 6,300 children by year end.

With over 18,000 new “shadow survivors” (siblings) each year in the U.S. and Canada, *SuperSibs!* has just begun to meet this growing demand. With the continued dedication, compassion and support of our donors, volunteers and leadership team, *SuperSibs!* will continue to make a lasting, positive difference for these at-risk children and their families.

It helps me deal with my feelings and they show lots of interest in what I'm feeling and thinking.

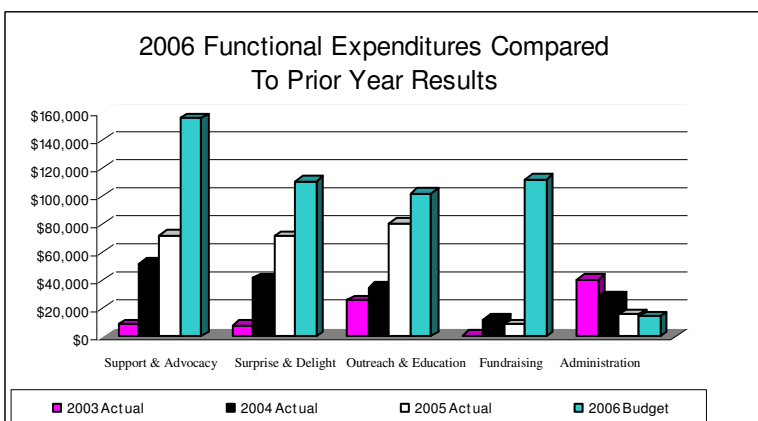
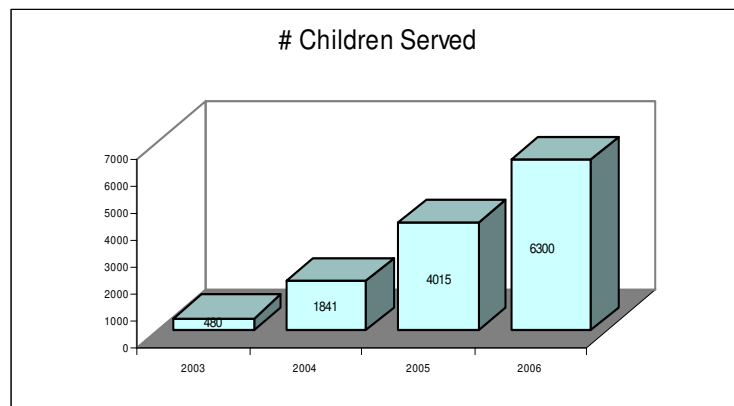
